MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to another informative edition of the University of Guam Fact Book! This publication is designed to be a convenient reference guide of data defining who we are as a university. With this year being our Platinum Jubilee — marking 70 years since the Territorial College of Guam was founded in 1952 — it is remarkable to look at the data and see how we've grown and progressed these past seven decades.

The 2021–2022 academic year was a transition year from the pandemic, with many classes still occurring online or in a hybrid format. This non-traditional way of learning has impacted university enrollment numbers nationwide. While enrollment at UOG has been less impacted than most universities, we have not been entirely spared. New freshmen for the 2021 academic



year decreased by about 6%, though we are confident we will see an increase in 2022 as 80% of classes return to an in-person format.

Notably, the slight decrease in new freshmen was more than offset by a nearly 34% increase in transfer students. One-third of these students transferred from regional colleges, while about one-quarter were transfers from colleges and universities in the U.S. mainland, Alaska, and Hawaii.

An important highlight in this year's Fact Book is our graduating seniors' highest ever scores in the California Critical Thinking Skills Test, a required assessment for UOG seniors to graduate. On average, our graduating seniors tested in the 40th percentile compared to students from other four-year open-enrollment universities — a score that has been gradually on the incline since UOG started administering the assessment in 2014.

With 554 graduates at the Fanuchanan 2021 and Fañomnakan 2022 commencements, we add to the more than 19,000 UOG alumni who are engaged, dynamic professionals in Guam, our neighboring island communities, and across the world. We are proud to continue to be the only U.S.-accredited university in the Western Pacific.

I hope this Fact Book will be a valuable resource as we continue advancing education in the island communities across this great region of Micronesia.

Institutional Profile

The University of Guam is an open-admissions, U.S. land-grant public comprehensive university offering on a semester basis 15 master's degree programs, 25 bachelor's degree programs, and several certificate programs in both onsite and online course offerings. These programs are administered by the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences ("CLASS"), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences ("CNAS"), the School of Business and Public Administration ("SBPA"), the School of Engineering ("SENG"), the School of Education ("SOE"), and the School of Health ("SOH"). In addition, continuing education unit (CEU) classes, professional development training, and English language training are offered through the Global Learning and Engagement (GLE) Office. The Enrollment Management & Student Success ("EMSS") Division supports student success and student life with services from Admissions & Records, Financial Aid Office, Residence Hall, Student Counseling, Student Health, Student Life Office, and TRiO Programs. Fanuchånan (Fall) 2021 student enrollment was 3,105. The University of Guam has conferred over 20,000 degrees over the past 70 years.

Research is an integral part of our mission, as UOG is a land-grant university. UOG's researchers from the various research units, including the Marine Lab, the Water & Environmental Research Institute, the Western Pacific Tropical Research Center, the Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research & Service, and the Micronesian Area Research Center, continue to support UOG's Para Hulo' strategic initiative of "being recognized as a RESEARCH UNIVERSITY centered in island wisdom." Through our diverse research portfolio — whether we are studying Karst geology, Guam's aquifer, childhood obesity, factors contributing to cancer health disparities, coral reef health,

developmental disabilities, endangered plants, or invasive species — we are contributing to the knowledge and wisdom of our island residents.

Our University holds an impressive national standing for an institution of our size. In the latest data released from the National Center for Science and Engineering Statistics, UOG ranks in the top 43% of institutions for total grant-funded research and development expenditures. We are pleased to report that continued progress has been made in our research efforts, and this has been another great year for research and scholarly achievements here at the University of Guam. In FY2021, UOG continued its ongoing grants, including the National Science Foundation-funded EPSCoR-GECCO grant, the National Cancer Institute-funded Pacific Island Partnership for Cancer Health Equity (U54-PIPCHE) grant, the National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration-funded Sea Grant, and CEDDERS funding. We also received new cycles of NASA EPSCoR Research Infrastructure Development funding and funding for the Pacific Islands Climate Adaptation Science Center. Additionally, the University was extremely fortunate to be granted \$8.5 million from the U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration to help fund construction of two new buildings on campus. Federal funding to UOG in FY2020 and FY2021 was unusually high, as with most other universities across the country, due to CARES Act funding. In FY2021, we continued to collaborate with multiple off-island scientists and institutions, provided employment to the local community, and offered students the opportunity to gain valuable research experience. 

FY 2021 Financial Trends

The University's overall financial position has been stable for the past years. Application of accounting standards pertaining to pensions (GASB 67,68,73) and post employment benefits other than pension (GASB 75) continues to have a significant impact on the University's financial statements. The University's financial position has been under pressure due to the following factors:


- The appropriation for FY21 was \$26.1 million about \$1.6 million less than FY20. The appropriation was further reduced to \$25.1 million in FY22.
- Enrollment for the Fanuchånan/Fall 2021 semester was 3,105. This was the sixth straight decline in enrollment. Despite the many challenges, the University's change in net position increased from a loss of \$2.8 million to a gain of \$5.6 million in FY21. Factors contributing to the gain are as follows:
 - Recovered expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19 through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). The revenue from HEERF has helped the University remain afloat in FY2021. HEERF is expected to expire in 2023.
 - An increase in grant activity, including a five-year \$20 million grant from the National Science EPSCoR, which
 includes the development of a database of marine life near and around the island.

COMPARATIVE REVENUES (IN \$1,000)

In FY2021, university-generated revenues amounted to \$75.4 million, or 66% of UOG's total revenue of \$114.8 million, with a Government of Guam allotment of \$34.2 million, or 30%, and other revenues of \$5.1 million or 4%. The University continues to experience an increase in federal grant activity, mainly pertaining to the

National Science Foundation's Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR), National Cancer Institute-funded Pacific Island Partnership for Cancer Health Equity (U54-PIPCHE), and Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF).




COMPARATIVE EXPENSES (IN \$1,000)

The University spent \$53.5 million, or 49%, of its total expenses of \$109.2 million directly on its Core Mission. Of that, 38% went to instruction, 25% to public service, and 37% to research. The changes in total expenses are mainly due to the application of GASB

Statement No.75 (GASB 75), Accounting and Financial Reporting for Post-employment Benefits Other Than Pensions, and expenses pertaining to campus safety and operations through HEERF.


'Yearly' Graph (1 Day Average)







Percentage of Total Students Enrolled & Total Credit Hour Production by College/School








Student Ethnicity


