#### **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

- •Must be a currently enrolled student or have completed ED384-70 (Student Academic & Counselor Training); or
- •a School of Education Graduate Student.

**QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:** Pursuant to Public Law 26-87 as amended by Public Law 29-113, all future employees of any position within the government of Guam will be required at minimum to possess one of the following:

- 1. A high school diploma; or
- 2. Successful completion of General Education Development (GED) Test; or
- 3. The equivalent of a general education high school program; or
- 4. Successful completion of a certification program, from a recognized accredited or certified vocational technical institution, in a specialized field for the job.

## KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES, AND/OR SKILLS:

Ability to work independently and responsibly. Ability to work respectfully with a variety of students and/or faculty. Ability to meet deadlines and accurately complete assigned tasks. Must have organizational skills to properly execute file management tasks. Must have exceptional reliability and ability to manage time with little supervision.

### **CHARACTER OF DUTIES:**

Under the direct supervision of the Dean, School of Education, the Peer Mentor will assist in the advisement of undergraduate students for the School of Education. The Peer Mentor will assist in tutoring/mentoring students, ensure that supplies are available for instructor and student use. Help link selected programs related to websites. Monitor student sign-up sheets, project assignments and related instructional activities. Perform other duties as assigned.

#### EDUCATION

Applicants claiming degrees or credit hours are required to have an original or copy of the documents (e.g., transcripts, high school diploma) or GED certification accompany the application.

#### **WORK ELIGIBILITY:**

Submission of completed job applications authorizes the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job-related may be investigated (i.e., previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records). All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job-related sources from legal liability for the information provided.

Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter. A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.

Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of the date reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position within the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with the law.

## **POLICE AND COURT CLEARANCE:**

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances.
