DESCRIPTION:

This course assists the K-12 School Counselors in facilitating and developing variety of Social Emotional Learning strategies within the school counseling instruction to engage all students. The course will apply the structure and sequence of a well-designed school counseling instruction for future classroom lessons using the ASCA National Model framework and SEL competencies.
